- ❖ Analyze specific management issues related to fecal and urinary diversions
- ❖ Assess the needs of special populations and incorporate identified needs into the Ostomy plan of care
- ❖ Distinguish between peristomal skin conditions and select the associated management strategies.
- ❖ Develop and implement an individualized management plan for the fistula patient that provides for containment of drainage and odour and protection of the peri-fistular skin.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The OCM is designed and intended solely for licensed health care professionals. Applicants for the OCM must meet all of the following criteria:

1. Active license as a Registered Nurse, Licensed Practical-Vocational Nurse, Nurse Practitioner, Physical Therapist, Physical Therapist Assistant, Occupational Therapist
2. Passport / ID
3. Complete Registration Form
4. Registration Payment slip
