Speakers Biography



Prof. R. Gary Sibbald (Canada)

Professor Gary Sibbald has been a wound care leader for over 35 years. As a dermatologist and internist, he recognized the unmet need for chronic wound care. His clinical patient-centric care has successfully treated complex wounds by reducing excessive pain, improving management of infection and increasing healing rate of chronic wounds.

As an educator, Dr. Sibbald was co-founder in 1999 of the International Interprofessional Wound Care Course (51st course Abu Dhabi Feb 2026). Professor Sibbald has been involved in many international projects to improve the health qualities in various countries including the Guyana Diabetes Foot Project that reduced lower limb amputation 68%.

He is the founder of WoundPedia and Project Lead for ECHO Ontario Skin & Wound. His continuing healthcare innovations in patient care, education and research have contributed to Canada's leadership in wound management.

Prof. Harikrishna Nair (Malaysia)

Professor Dr. Harikrishna K. R. Nair is a globally renowned clinician, academic, and leader in wound care, diabetic limb preservation, and tissue repair. He currently serves as Chairman of Wounds Malaysia and Head of the Wound Care Unit, Department of Internal Medicine, Kuala Lumpur Hospital, Malaysia. He is also the National Advisor for Primary Health at the Ministry of Health, Malaysia.

Professor Nair holds several prominent international leadership roles, including President of the World Union of Wound Healing Societies (WUWHS), Chairman of the ASEAN Wound Council, and Vice President of the Asian Wound Care Association (AWCA). He is the President-Elect of the Asia Pacific Association on Diabetic Limb Problems and a member of the Board of the International Biotherapy Society. His academic appointments span multiple countries. He is an Adjunct Professor at the Department of Surgery, Institute of Medical Sciences, Banaras Hindu University, India; Professor at the Institute of Health Management, Austria; and Associate Professor of Research at Perdana University, Malaysia. He also serves as Chairman of the Pressure Injury Prevention Committee at Kuala Lumpur Hospital.

Professor Nair has made significant contributions to scientific publishing and education. He is the Editor-in-Chief of Wounds Asia Journal and the Journal of Wound Care (JWC) Silk Road Supplement, and a Board Member of the Journal of Wound Care, UK. He also serves on the EWMA International Partner Organisation Board and the National Technical Committee on Wound Care, Ministry of Health, Malaysia.

In recognition of his outstanding global contributions to wound care and public health, Professor Dr. Harikrishna K. R. Nair was a recipient of the WHO Dr. Lee Jong-wook Memorial Award in 2018.



Dr. Elizabeth A. Ayello (USA)

Elizabeth A. Ayello, PhD, MS, RN, CWON, FAAN, is a board-certified wound and ostomy nurse from Queens, New York City, USA, and is internationally recognized as an educator, researcher, clinician, prolific author, editor, and mentor in wound, ostomy, and pressure injury care.

Dr. Ayello currently serves as Co-Editor-in-Chief of the international interprofessional journal *Advances in Skin and Wound Care* and Executive Editor Emeritus of the WCET® Journal. She is President of Ayello Harris & Associates Inc., Faculty member of the International Interprofessional Wound Care Course (IIWCC) in Toronto and Abu Dhabi, and Founder and Director of the WoundPedia Basic and Intermediate courses in Manila, Philippines.

She is a past President of both the World Council of Enterostomal Therapists (WCET®) and the National Pressure Injury Advisory Panel (NPIAP). Dr. Ayello is actively involved in the development of global clinical guidelines and is a member of the EPUAP–NPIAP–PPPIA Guideline Governance Group contributing to the 4th edition of the International Pressure Injury Prevention and Treatment Guidelines (2025–2026). She is also a core member of the WCET® and International Society of University Colon and Rectal Surgeons (ISCURP) group developing the 3rd edition of the International Ostomy Guideline.

Prof. Kimberly LeBlanc (Canada)

Kimberly LeBlanc the current Academic Chair of the Association for Nurses Specialized in Wound Ostomy and Continence Canada's (NSWOCC) Wound Ostomy and Continence Institute (WOC Institute), and an Advanced Practice and Certified Wound, Ostomy, and Continence nurse with KDS Professional Consulting. Kimberly is the current President of the Canadian Nurses Association. She holds a Doctorate of Philosophy in Nursing. In 2020, she was inducted as a Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Nursing (FCAN), in 2025 she was inducted as Fellow of Nurses, Specialized in Wound, Ostomy and Continence (FNSWOC) and a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing (FAAN). In 2025 she received a King Charles III coronation medal for her contribution to nursing in Canada.

Kimberly is a past president of the International Skin Tear Advisory Panel and past co-chair of the Canadian Pressure Injury Advisory Panel. She is currently a board member of the World Union of Wound Healing Societies (WUWHS) and the International Wound Infection Institute (IWII).

Kimberly has lectured extensively on wound and ostomy care and is considered a global expert on wounds and ostomy issues in the aging population and has numerous publications and book chapters on wound, ostomy, and continence related topics.



Prof. Kylie Sandy-Hodgetts (Australia)

Kylie is Associate Professor, Personalised Medicine Centre, Murdoch University and Honorary Senior Lecturer, School of Medicine, Cardiff University. She is Founder and President of a not-for-profit association, the International Surgical Wound Association (ISWA), recipient of the JWC Most Progressive Society Award 2025. Kylie is a Research Scientist and Chief Investigator of several clinical trials (Phase 1-IV) investigating early detection, prevention and management of surgical wound complications.

She has Chaired and co-authored over 5 international clinical consensus documents, first authored over 40 original research papers and chaired the ISWA Global Guideline for Postoperative Incision Care. She is a regular peer reviewer for Q1 journals and serves on several journal editorial boards and industry advisory panels. Kylie is Chair of the Murdoch University EMCR Advisory Group and Panel Member of the West Australian EMCR Group. She is also a Fellow of the Women's Health Translation Emerging Leader Programme. Kylie is currently ranked #1 on the global Expertscape for surgical wound dehiscence.

Dr. Bharat Kotru (India)

Dr. Bharat Kotru (India) is a Podiatrist and Wound Care Specialist and serves as Head of the Department of Podiatry and Wound Care at Max Super Speciality Hospital, Punjab, India. He is also a Faculty Member of the International Interprofessional Wound Care Course (IIWCC). Dr. Kotru completed his postgraduate studies at Karnataka University and earned a PhD in Diabetes and Atherosclerosis from JNV University. He further strengthened his international expertise by completing the International Interprofessional Wound Care Course (IIWCC) at the University of Toronto, Canada, in 2015, where he received the IIWCC Best Selective Award for his project titled "Effect of Intensive Education and Self-Care on Wound Healing Trajectory."

He holds an MSc in Clinical Skin Integrity and Wound Management from the University of Hertfordshire, UK, and has received specialized training in diabetic foot care at the Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences. In addition, he has completed multiple national and international certification courses in diabetic foot care and diabetes management. Dr. Kotru has published extensively in national and international journals and is recognized as the first podiatrist in the Punjab region to integrate biomechanics and orthotic therapy into routine clinical practice. He has also contributed to a research project of the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) in collaboration with the World Health Organization (WHO) on hypertension and diabetes.

He works collaboratively with multidisciplinary healthcare teams to deliver advanced assessment, management, and treatment of lower limb pathologies, with a special focus on developing cost-effective orthotic, offloading devices, and foot examination tools tailored for developing countries.



Ms. Widasari Sri Gitarja (Indonesia)

Widasari Sri Gitarja is a distinguished leader in Wound, Ostomy, and Continence (WOC) care, serving as Chief Executive Officer of WOCARE Indonesia, Corporate University of WOCARE Indonesia, and Program Director of the Indonesian ETNEP—WCET. With over 20 years of experience across clinical practice, education, and strategic leadership, she has played a pivotal role in advancing wound care services, professional training, and policy advocacy in Indonesia and the Asia-Pacific region.

She has held influential roles on national and international boards, including InWCCA, INPANA, WCET, ASEAN Wound Council (AWC), and APADLP, contributing to regional capacity building and global collaboration. Widely recognized for pioneering wound assessment scales and the 7 Steps Disaster Wound Management framework, her work has strengthened evidence-based practice in routine and emergency settings. Her excellence has been honored with multiple international awards, including Gold, Silver, and Bronze distinctions from the Journal of Wound Care Awards and IIWCG recognition in 2025

Prof. Guido Ciprandi (Italy)

Guido Ciprandi is a pediatric and plastic surgeon and Adjunct Professor of Plastic, Reconstructive, and Aesthetic Surgery at the University of Padua. Founding President of ISPeW and President of the Pediatric Wound Care Masterclass, he serves on the EWMA Council, chairs the WUWHS Liaison Committee, and is an ALHIPE Ambassador. Former Head of Pediatric Wound Care at Bambino Gesù Children's Hospital in Rome, he has received multiple international awards, including the EPUAP Experienced Investigator Award (2022) and the IIWCG Outstanding Wound Care Clinician Achievement Award (2025). He sits on the editorial boards of JWC, IWJ, and GWCJ and is the author of over 120 scientific publications and two books on Neonatal and Pediatric Wound Care.

Dr. Ibby Younis (UK)

Dr. Ibby Younis is a consultant plastic and reconstructive surgeon specialising in breast, abdomen, skin and body contouring surgery. After attending the University of Wales, Mr Younis undertook his general surgical training in London during which time he obtained his membership of the Royal College of Surgeons of England. He completed postgraduate studies at Queen Mary, University of London achieving a Master of Science in Surgical Skills and Sciences. Following this, Mr Younis completed his higher specialist training in plastic surgery at prestigious units including Cambridge University Hospitals, Imperial College Healthcare and Barts Health, and was awarded a Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeons in plastic surgery.
